***2016 38th Yamaha Australian Four Day Enduro
Mansfield Victoria***

14th - 19th November 2016

It was a frantic few days leading up to our time at the 2016 Aussie Four Day Enduro – work, kids and all that stuff. But me and photographer **Jo** finally jumped into the landcruiser at 5pm on Tuesday to spend the rest of the week helping out and covering the biggest enduro event on the Australian off-road calendar. **Daniel Milner** #1 was aiming for his fifth Australian Four Day title in a row and had come back from injury earlier this year fighting fit aboard a fresh Yamaha YZ450F. He certainly looked the goods and we believed it was within his grasp. But KTM mounted **Daniel Chucky Sanders** has had a stellar year in the AORC and VORC champs as well as the ISDE and would be hungry for the title. And then there was **Mathias Bellino** – the Frenchman on board a Husky with a definite ambition to beat the Aussies on their own soil.

120 riders started and 96 completed the four days, which was a good result for an event of this nature, and the weather and track conditions were very forgiving. The parc ferme was established at the Merrijig rodeo venue of McCormack Park – a level, clear and very scenic spot and the focal point for the teams, riders, support crews, volunteers and medics.

PROLOGUE – DAY 0 TUESDAY

We weren't there for the Prologue day which was won by Frenchman **Mathias Bellino** #21 on his Husqvarna TE500 – a sign of things to come. A little bit of strategy was being played out amongst the pros with some preferring not to be on the front of the grid to hopefully get the better tracks behind the front runners. Riders were seeded for Day 1 based on this Prologue AND on their placings in the 2015 Four Day Enduro.

DAY 1 WEDNESDAY



Perfect weather conditions kicked off the official start of the event. Riders had a short 10 minute work period before setting out in threes on their appointed minute:

Then it was up to us to chase the riders – I was working with the Dandenong MCC crew at the KTM special test and Jo was hitch hiking around the other tests.

Once I finished at the KTM test I headed over to the Husqvarana/Westley test. I would call this an old-school special test which was tight, rocky and twisted and wound its way over the side of the hill as well as up and down which meant most of the time you were in first, second and third. 



Then bikes were then impounded for the night, ready for the next grueling day.

DAY 2, THURSDAY

The riders had their biggest day today, with 9 special tests and a long trail ride up through Jamieson leaving many caught for time on the race back to the parc ferme for the 14:55 time control at McCormack Park. Maybe a hiccup in the planning of the timing given the distances they had to ride which saw everyone lose time, but this was given back when the organisers realized they had made that error in calculation.

We heard that experienced enduro rider **Broc Grabham** #37 had calculated the times and special tests even before he had left the parc ferme and predicted that this day was going to be very tight and didn't think they would make the times.

DAY 4 FINAL MOTO, SATURDAY

With the racing scheduled to start mid morning we had a leisurely breakfast before heading to the grass track moto in Barwite, laid out by the Mansfield MCC and **Glenn Capuano**. Glenn was organizing proceedings as we arrived and a good turn out of volunteers meant all jobs were quickly filled. The Restarters got to race first – these are the riders that were unable to finish the event for whatever reason – timed out, mechanical issues etc but were given a last opportunity to compete. The track was skatey with morning dew but quickly dried and became dusty – and still skatey - in parts. The E2 race was split into two heats to avoid riders behind the leaders getting into trouble with the dust.

Racing was all over by 2:45pm and after a short break the presentations took place, with MA's **Chris Gray** and **Don Atkins** introducing the winners. But there was someone else giving out awards this week...

The PRO-fessor drove his little red Citroen 2CV down to Mansfield from the Supercross where he'd been working with the development of a special Yamaha bike and rider. That's all we'll say because all he told us was "*two little ducks, work it out for yourself*".

But **The PRO-fessor** was here to cast his bespectacled eyes over the Four Day riders. He congratulated **Bryan Noble** and the Dandenong MCC team over the layout of the Husqvarna test which reminded him of an old school course, tight and technical. **Bryan**, his wife **Michelle**

and sons **Jake** and **Scott** received the "Superhuman Effort" award for their commitment to this event. And for the very welcome and tasty catering distributed to the Dandenong workers.

8 women competed in this event and 6 finished. **Tayla Jones** #83 was the highest finisher with 32nd outright. The top three finishers in the Women's class were also the team that has now won the ISDE Womens trophy four times. A great sporting achievement for Australia.




